- 1) Which organisation is the incumbent provider of the non-emergency patient transport service for Greater Huddersfield CCG/ North Kirklees CCG?**

Yorkshire Ambulance Service NHS Trust is the provider for the provision of Non-Emergency Patient Transport (NEPTS).

On 1 April 2021, NHS Greater Huddersfield and NHS North Kirklees Clinical Commissioning Groups (CCGs) merged to form NHS Kirklees CCG.

- 2) When did this contract to provide non-emergency patient transport commence?**

The service for the provision of NEPTS commenced on 1 April 2019.

- 3) When is this contract to provide non-emergency patient transport due to expire?**

The service for the provision of NEPTS contract expires on 31 March 2024.

- 3) Is there an optional extension period for this contract, and if so how long?**

There is no extension period for the NEPTS contract.

- 4) What is the annual contract value?**

NHS Kirklees CCG's annual NEPTS contract value 2019/20 - £2,733,194. The most recent contract value is 2019/20 as no financial block value was agreed for 2020/21 during the COVID-19 pandemic, in line with national guidance.

- 6) Is this contract commissioned by Greater Huddersfield CCG / North Kirklees CCG in isolation or is it commissioned across multiple CCGs? If this is commissioned jointly, which CCG is the lead commissioning authority?**

NHS Kirklees CCG is an associate CCG to the West Yorkshire NEPTS contract which includes: NHS Leeds CCG, NHS Wakefield CCG, NHS Bradford District and Craven CCG for which the lead commissioner is NHS Calderdale CCG.
